

#### A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Michael McElligott called to order the Regular Board Meeting of the Palm Beach Plantation Community Development District of May 18, 2022, at 4:03 p.m. in the Palm Beach Plantation Clubhouse located at 8751 Palm Beach Plantation Boulevard, Royal Palm Beach, Florida 33411.

#### **B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION**

Mr. McElligott presented proof of publication that notice of the Regular Board Meeting had been published in *The Palm Beach Post* on April 28, 2022, and May 5, 2022, as legally required.

#### C. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

Present and constituting a quorum were Chairman Russell Warnet, Vice Chairman Richard Feltz and Supervisors Richard Brackett, and Robert Vey.

Staff in attendance were District Managers Michael McElligott of Special District Services, Inc., Engineer Matthew Kahn of Caulfield & Wheeler Inc., and District Counsel Scott Cochran of Billing, Cochran, Lyles, Mauro & Ramsey, P.A.

#### D. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no additions or deletions to the agenda.

#### E. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

There were no comments from the public for items not on the agenda.

#### F. APPROVAL OF MINUTES 1. March 16, 2022, Regular Board Meeting

Mr. McElligott presented the minutes of the March 16, 2022, Regular Board Meeting and asked if there were any changes or corrections. There were none.

A motion was then made by Mr. Brackett, seconded by Mr. Feltz, that the minutes of the March 16, 2022, Regular Board Meeting be approved. Upon being put to a vote, the motion carried 4 to 0.

#### G. PUBLIC HEARING

The public hearing was opened at 4:04 p.m.

#### 1. Proof of Publication

Mr. McElligott presented proof of publication that notice of the Public Hearing had been published in *The Palm Beach Post* on April 28, 2022, and May 5, 2022, as legally required.

#### 2. Receive Public Comment on Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Final Budget

There was no public comment on the Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Final Budget.

#### 3. Consider Resolution No. 2022-02 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Final Budget

Mr. McElligott presented Resolution No. 2022-02, entitled:

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-02**

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE PALM BEACH PLANTATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ADOPTING A FISCAL YEAR 2022/2023 BUDGET.

Mr. McElligott presented the budget and explained that this is the same budget the Board had approved as a proposed budget. Mr. Brackett asked for some clarification on the reserve calculation, which Mr. McElligott was able to provide.

After a brief discussion, a **motion** was made by Mr. Feltz, seconded by Mr. Brackett and passed unanimously to adopt Resolution No. 2022-02, as presented.

#### H. OLD BUSINESS 1. Discussion on Lake Level Issue

Mr. McElligott refreshed the Board on the lake level issue discussed at previous meetings. District Engineer, Matthew Kahn gave some possible explanations of factors that could lead to the levels being seen. Some of these could be natural factors out of the districts control, some could be infrastructure problems that would need to be fixed. After a lengthy discussion, the Board came to a consensus to have Mr. Khan do a simple visual inspection of some of the pipes as an inexpensive first step and then report back to the Board.

#### 2. Discussion on Erosion Issue

Mr. McElligott and Mr. Khan reminded the Board that they had done a lake study in the past that identified the likely order of lake bank erosion projects that would need to be done based on the estimated condition of the various lakes. During the discussion it was decided that it was nearing time to do the next project. Mr. McElligott noted that depending on size of the project, there should be funds available in the upcoming year from the reserve funds accumulated. The Board authorized Mr. Kahn to do a visual inspection of the lakes that would be next in line for the erosion project and report back to the Board with his recommendation.

#### I. NEW BUSINESS

#### 1. Consider Resolution No. 2022-03 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Meeting Schedule

Mr. McElligott presented Resolution No. 2022-03, entitled:

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-03**

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE PALM BEACH PLANTATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, ESTABLISHING A REGULAR MEETING SCHEDULE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022/2023 AND SETTING THE TIME AND LOCATION OF SAID DISTRICT MEETINGS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. McElligott presented the meeting schedule which is similar to the current meeting schedule.

After a brief discussion, a **motion** was made by Mr. Brackett, seconded by Mr. Vey, and passed unanimously to adopt Resolution No. 2022-03, as presented.

## 2. Discussion Regarding Dodd Frank Act Effecting Palm Beach Plantation CDD

Mr. McElligott refreshed the Board that this question was brought up by Mr. Brackett at a previous meeting. Mr. McElligott provided the response from the trustee bank which stated that there is nothing in Dodd Frank that could negatively affect the Palm Beach Plantation CDD. Mr. Brackett asked Mr. McElligott to specifically ask the trustee about "Bail-Ins" mentioned in Dodd Frank. Mr. McElligott will report back the response.

#### 3. Discussion on Starting Bond Refinance Early

Mr. McElligott explained that he asked the underwriter about the possibilities of starting the process of refinancing the bonds now, instead of waiting. Mr. McElligott shared with the Board the underwriters response which shows that the Bond documents do not allow for any refinance until 2024, so there is nothing we can do until then.

#### J. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS 1. Financial Report

Mr. McElligott presented the financial report in the meeting package.

#### 2. Other Updated

Mr. McElligott also reminded the Board that Form 1s are coming due soon and of the qualifying period in June for those seats up this November.

#### K. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

There were no Board Member comments.

#### L. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, a **motion** was made by Mr. Brackett, seconded by Mr. Feltz to adjourn the Regular Board Meeting at 4:57 p.m. That **motion** carried 4 to 0.

Good morning Michael,

Our inspectors completed their report previously but I asked that they revisit the site to reconfirm a few questions of mine. They have now completed that revisit as well.

The first note is that the inspector did not see any difference in lake elevation between the 3 easternmost lakes on Palm Beach Plantation. It may still be a good idea to have lake elevation gauges installed in any of the lakes of concern to measure actual water elevations to potentially confirm elevation variances.

The inspector did not find any existing pipe plugs or obstructions in any of the lake interconnect pipes interconnecting the three easternmost lakes on the project. There was sediment buildup in some of the structure sumps/bottoms but not enough to reduce pipe flow between the lakes. Please keep in mind, this inspection was from the surface such that a potential break/blockage in pipes between structures would not be readily visible to our inspector.

If the CDD is still concerned with lake elevations, the following are some options to further diagnose the potential issues.

- 1. Installation of lake elevation gauges in an lakes of concern to measure actual lake water elevations and any potential variance between the lakes.
- 2. Hiring of a 3<sup>rd</sup> party pipe cleaning contractor such as Shenandoah who could clean and more importantly CCTV the existing pipe interconnects between the structures to determine a potential pipe blockage or break between the drainage structures.
